

Expanded Post-Secondary Options Counseling Curriculum

Total Units: 20 (10 hours total)

This curriculum provides a deeper exploration of post-secondary pathways, financial planning, and career readiness. It allows for more personalized support, practical exercises, and student engagement.

Session 1: Introduction to Post-Secondary Pathways - 4 Units (2 Hours)

Goal: Understand different post-secondary options and assess student interests.

Topics Covered:

- Overview of college, trade schools, apprenticeships, military, and direct-to-workforce pathways.
- Identifying strengths, interests, and career aspirations.
- Understanding disability support services available in post-secondary settings.

Activities:

- Career Interest Inventory to assess student preferences.
- Group discussion on personal goals and aspirations.
- Research different post-secondary pathways and discuss pros/cons.

Outcome: Students identify 2-3 potential career or education paths for further exploration.

Session 2: College & Vocational Training Exploration - Units (2 Hours)

Goal: Research and evaluate higher education options.

Topics Covered:

- Difference between community colleges, universities, trade schools, and certification programs.
- Understanding degree programs and career alignment.
- Admission requirements (GPA, SAT/ACT, application essays).
- Disability resource centers & accommodations in college.

Activities:

- Research and compare 3 post-secondary programs using structured templates.
- Explore school websites and identify application deadlines.
- Begin a college or vocational training application plan.

Outcome: Students create a shortlist of post-secondary institutions or programs.

Session 3: Financial Planning & Application Support - 4 Units (2 Hours)

Goal: Help students navigate financial aid, budgeting, and applications.

Topics Covered:

- FAFSA, Pell Grants, state aid, and scholarships for students with disabilities.
- Understanding student loans vs. grants vs. work-study options.
- Budgeting for school (tuition, housing, books, living expenses).
- · Personal statements, essays, and letters of recommendation.

Activities:

- Create a financial aid checklist and begin FAFSA.
- Identify and apply for at least one scholarship.
- Draft a **personal statement** for college or job applications.

Outcome: Students complete at least one financial aid application and finalize a college or job application essay draft.

Session 4: Workforce & Alternative Career Pathways - 4 Units (2 Hours)

Goal: Explore career options outside traditional college paths.

Topics Covered:

- Trade certifications, apprenticeships, and vocational programs.
- Military service as a career option.
- Entrepreneurship & self-employment for students with disabilities.
- Employer expectations, interview readiness, and professional skills.

Activities:

- Identify 3 career pathways and explore related training options.
- Conduct a mock job interview and receive feedback.
- Research local apprenticeship or job training programs.

Outcome: Students develop an understanding of different career paths and complete a **career exploration worksheet**.

Session 5: Decision-Making & Transition Planning - 4 Units (2 Hours)

Goal: Finalize a **personalized transition plan** with next steps.

Topics Covered:

- · Decision-making strategies and evaluating options.
- Planning for a smooth transition (accommodations, transportation, life skills).
- Identifying and leveraging support systems (family, ACCESS-VR, mentors).
- Reviewing important deadlines and action items.

Activities:

- Complete a Post-Secondary Transition Plan, outlining education or career goals.
- Finalize applications or job search steps.
- Conduct a self-advocacy role-play (practicing requesting accommodations or job interviews).

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- Complete a Post-Secondary Transition Plan, outlining education or career goals.
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Outcome: Each student leaves with a clear, actionable **transition plan** and confidence in their next steps.

Additional Support Components

- ✓ Parental Workshops Educating families on financial aid, disability services, and transition planning.
- 1-on-1 Advising For students needing individualized support beyond group sessions.
- ★ College & Career Fairs Connecting students with admissions representatives and employers.
- **Ongoing Check-ins** Follow-up meetings to track progress and adjust plans.
