Course Overview

This counseling program provides individuals with disabilities the **knowledge**, **skills**, **and resources** to explore post-secondary educational and vocational opportunities. Through **individualized coaching**, **strategic planning**, **and assistive technology integration**, participants will gain the **confidence**, **self-advocacy skills**, **and tools necessary** to transition successfully into higher education, vocational training, or employment pathways.

Course Objectives

By the end of this program, participants will be able to:

- **Identify** their strengths, interests, and career goals.
- Explore post-secondary education, vocational training, and career options.
- Navigate the admissions, financial aid, and disability services process.
- **Develop** essential academic, vocational, and life skills for success.
- Advocate for their needs using self-advocacy and accessibility strategies.
- **Utilize** technology and virtual platforms to enhance learning and independence.

Session Breakdown

Session 1: Introduction & Individualized Assessment

Duration: 1 unit (30 minutes)

Topics Covered:

- Welcome and program overview
- Comprehensive needs assessment (career goals, educational interests, strengths, challenges)
- Identifying **potential barriers** and creating solutions
- Introduction to **assistive technology tools** (screen readers, note-taking apps, scheduling software)

Outcome:

• Personalized transition plan framework with targeted action steps

Session 2: Exploring Post-Secondary & Vocational Pathways

Duration: 2 units (1 hour)

Topics Covered:

- Overview of college, trade schools, apprenticeships, and employment options
- Understanding degree vs. certificate vs. vocational training programs
- Admissions process: application deadlines, requirements, and strategic planning
- **Financial aid & scholarships:** FAFSA, grants, and funding opportunities for students with disabilities
- Introduction to career exploration platforms & virtual college tours

Outcome:

• Customized list of post-secondary programs with key application deadlines

Session 3: Academic & Vocational Skill Development

Duration: 2 units (1 hour)

Topics Covered:

- Time management and organizational strategies for academic success
- Study techniques and adaptive learning strategies
- **Digital literacy & workplace readiness** (resume building, email etiquette, professional communication)
- Assistive technology for learning and productivity (speech-to-text tools, digital planners, accessible research databases)

Outcome:

Personalized academic & vocational success toolkit

Session 4: Self-Advocacy & Accessibility Services

Duration: 1 unit (30 minutes)

Topics Covered:

- Understanding disability rights and ADA compliance in education and employment
- How to **request accommodations** (classroom modifications, workplace adjustments, note-taking assistance)
- Navigating college disability offices & vocational support services
- Strategies for effective self-advocacy and independent problem-solving

Outcome:

• Individualized accommodation and resource plan for post-secondary success

Session 5: Final Transition Planning & Follow-Up

Duration: 2 units (1 hour)

Topics Covered:

- **Review of transition plan progress** and finalizing next steps
- Assisting with application submission (college, vocational programs, financial aid)
- Creating a follow-up strategy for long-term support
- Guidance on career mentoring & professional networking opportunities

Outcome:

• Completed, actionable transition plan with defined steps for post-secondary success

Materials Needed

- Notebook & pen for notes and goal tracking
- Online access to college & vocational resources (provided by the instructor)
- Assistive technology tools (as applicable) for accessibility and digital learning
- Admissions & financial aid documentation (for application support)

Assessment & Success Metrics

Participants will be evaluated based on:

- Completion of an **individualized transition plan** with clear next steps
- Demonstrated understanding of post-secondary options & accessibility resources
- Development of self-advocacy skills and ability to request accommodations
- Engagement in skill-building activities and readiness for transition
